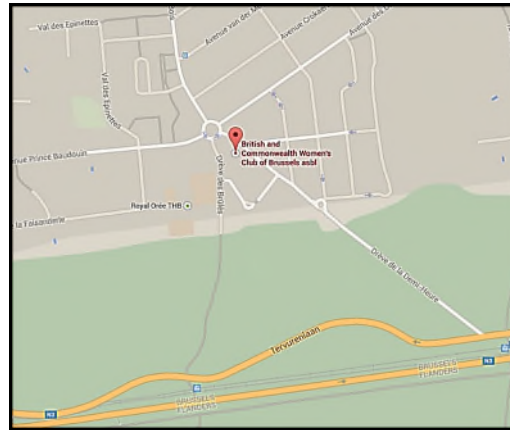

### How to get to the Clubhouse

The Club is not far from Stockel and just off junction 1 on the Ring. It is easily accessible by car, tram or bus.



#### By tram from Montgomery:

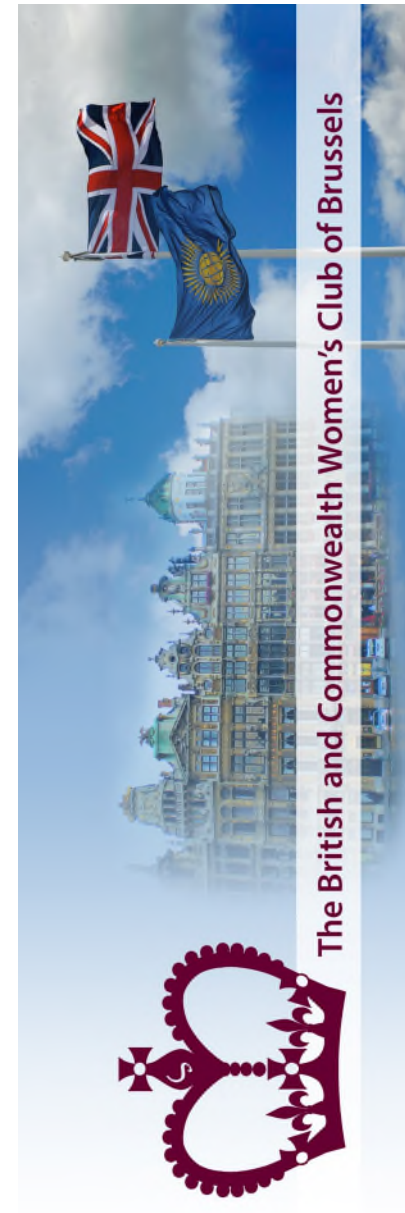
**Line 39:** get off at the 'rue au Bois' stop

**Line 44:** get off at the 'Duivenschiëting/Tir aux Pigeons' stop. Walk along Halfuurdreef/Avenue de la Demi-Heure, which becomes Rue au Bois.

Both lines can also be picked up at the tram terminal

#### By bus

**Line 36** runs between Schuman and Konkel. Get off at the stop 'Avenue Vandermeersch' (just off Rue au Bois).

## The Club

The BCWCB was founded in 1963 and has existed ever since as a place to meet up and where newcomers can ease the process of settling into a new community.

Membership is for women of all ages who are themselves, or who are married to, citizens of the UK or a Commonwealth country. However, women of other nationalities who share an interest in the Club's aims and activities are more than welcome to join as well. There is an annual membership fee.

Links to the Commonwealth are reinforced through our patrons who also support and organise regular events.

The Club is a non-profit making organisation and is run by its Members. It supports two (usually different) charities each year for which it organises fund-raising events.

The Clubhouse and its facilities are open Monday to Friday from 10.00 until 15.00. Everything is run by volunteer Club members. It is a friendly, welcoming place to meet over coffee or lunch.

Talks and demonstrations are organised in addition to the regular calendar of activities and classes.
