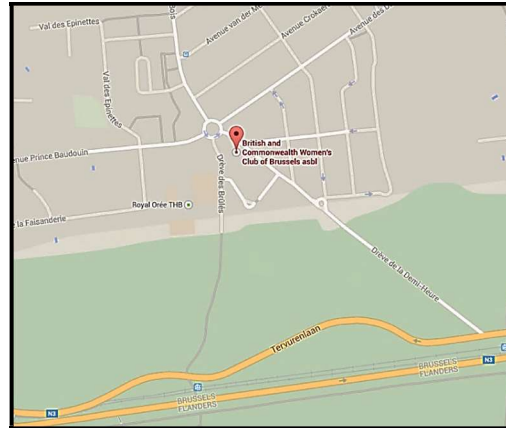

How to get to the Clubhouse

The Club is not far from Stockel and just off junction 1 on the Ring. It is easily accessible by car, tram or bus.



By tram from Montgomery:

Line 39: get off at the 'rue au Bois' stop

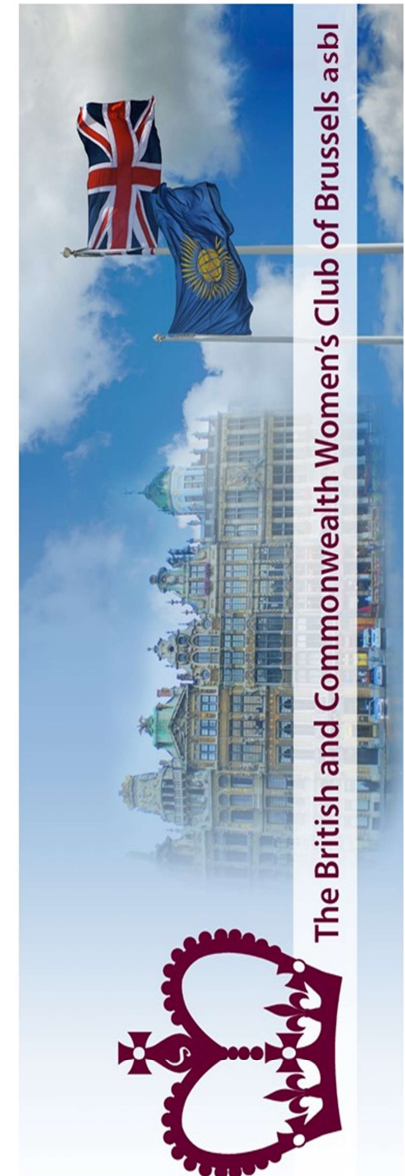
Line 44: get off at the 'Duivenschiëting/Tir aux Pigeons' stop. Walk along Halfuurdreef/Avenue de la Demi-Heure, which becomes Rue au Bois.

Both lines can also be picked up at the tram terminal

By bus

Line 36 runs between Schuman and Konkel. Get off at the stop 'Avenue Vandermeersch' (just off Rue au Bois).
